AUA's medical education satisfies the medical school requirements for licensure to practice medicine in all 50 US states. AUA graduates who meet the qualifications for licensure in countries outside the US may also be licensed in those countries.

Based on a review of AUA's curriculum by UK's General Medical Council (GMC), any doctor awarded a primary medical qualification from AUA will be able to apply to sit the PLAB test and for GMC registration without having their qualification individually assessed.
