- Official transcripts from all secondary and post-secondary schools attended.
- Two official letters of recommendation, one of which must be from a teacher/professor from a science course.
- A personal statement explaining:
 - » Why you are considering a career in your chosen field of study.
 - » How you will be an asset to the college.
 - » Your accomplishments, activities, and any other information you feel is necessary.
- A passport-sized photo.
- A completed application form.
- A non-refundable \$75 (USD) application fee in the form of a U.S.- or Canadian-drawn check or money order made payable to the American International College of Arts and Sciences - Antigua.

The AICASA curriculum is ideal for high school graduates and nontraditional students who are passionate about becoming physicians. The curriculum provides a comprehensive approach to premedical training, emphasizing the development of critical thinking skills.

AICASA is accredited by the U.S. Accrediting Council of Independent Colleges and Schools (ACICS) to award an Associate of Science Degree in Health Sciences.

Applicants must have earned a high school diploma, 5th-form diploma, or equivalent, with a GPA of at least 2.80. Caribbean Community (CARICOM) applicants should also have CSEC scores of 1 or 2 in English, mathematics, physics, chemistry, and biology. One score of 3 is permitted. Students may use CAPE scores to substitute for CSEC scores. SAT and ACT scores from CARICOM students and other foreign graduates are not required but encouraged. Candidates whose native language is not English must present scores from the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) or the International English Language Testing System (IELTS).

ON-CAMPUS

GROUP 1
