 - » How you will be an asset to the college.
 - » Your accomplishments, activities, and any other information you feel is necessary.
- A non-refundable \$75 (USD) application fee.

After two years of undergraduate coursework with an emphasis on the health sciences, successful students earn an Associate of Science (AS) degree in Health Sciences. Upon completion of the health sciences curriculum with a minimum cumulative GPA set by the medical school, AICASA graduates are given preferential admission status by AUA.

AICASA's academic curriculum includes courses that are typically considered prerequisites for entry into US or Canadian medical school programs. The curriculum also helps students build the foundational skills and knowledge they need to succeed when they begin the Pre-Clinical Sciences component of a medical education program.

The AICASA curriculum is ideal for high school graduates and nontraditional students who are passionate about becoming physicians. The curriculum provides a comprehensive approach to premedical training, emphasizing the development of critical thinking skills.

AICASA is approved to award associate degrees by the Ministry of Education of the Government of Antigua and Barbuda.

Applicants will have earned a high school diploma, or equivalent, with a GPA of at least 2.8 based on a 4.0 system, and at least 1000 or 24 on the first two sections of the SAT or in total for the ACT, respectively. SAT and ACT scores from students from CARICOM and other foreign graduates are not required but encouraged.

Applicants from Caribbean Community (CARICOM) countries will have earned a high school diploma, fifth-form diploma or its equivalent, with a GPA of at least 2.8 based on a 4.0 system. The applicant must also have CSEC (CXC) scores of 1 or 2 in the following subjects: English, Mathematics, Chemistry, and Biology. A score of 3 is allowed in one subject. Physics is encouraged but not required.

HOUSING OPTIONS



ON CAMPUS

AUA's brand-new campus housing units are just a three-minute walk from class. Expect modern amenities, weekly complimentary housekeeping, WI-FI, and other great housing features.

OFF CAMPUS: GROUP 1

Group 1 offers the most upscale apartments. All have modern kitchen appliances and private bathrooms. Many have decks directly on or overlooking the ocean.

OFF CAMPUS: GROUP 2

Group 2 housing includes one-bedroom, two-bedroom, or three-bedroom apartment options. These units are a good middle ground that offers students all the comforts of home.

Group 3 housing features budget-friendly apartment complexes that are comfortable and affordable. These housing sites are approximately a five-to 10-minute drive from campus.
